Bluegrass Printmaking Cooperative

The mission of the Bluegrass Printmakers' Cooperative (BPC) is to be a thriving print studio in the Lexington area where printmakers work and discuss prints and art. BPC provides demonstrations and workshops to educate the community about printmaking process. BPC exhibit and promote their art throughout the region. The coop consists of artists working in all types of print media: collagraphs, lithographs, monoprints, etchings, woodcuts, linoleum cuts, and solar etchings. Members showcase these different techniques during Lexington's Gallery Hops. The group promotes printmaking through exhibitions and community outreach.

Bluegrass Printmakers' Cooperative is for advanced-level printmakers who want to work on their own. Fees include studio time, tools and equipment use. Participants must provide their ink and paper. Participants have open access to the studio during business hours, but scheduled classes have studio priority. Participants must apply for acceptance into the coop.
